

FROM THE PRESIDENT'S DESK

Welcome to the 2025 ASSG Awards, celebrating excellence in sound for the screen here at the glorious Ritz Cinema. Congratulations to all our nominees and winners.

The year began with some clouds over our sector. Many members shared their concerns with me and I felt them too, with plenty of bills and not enough bookings. The closure of Cutting Edge, after decades of respected post-production work, came as a shock and highlighted the challenges facing our industry. Thankfully, things have improved and production activity is beginning to ramp up again.

Two major issues have dominated ASSG and ASIG lobbying efforts, together with SPA and MEAA: Al legislation and production quotas for streaming services.

I've held several meetings with Carol Berry MP, my local member, who has raised our concerns with the Minister for the Arts, Tony Burke. While the responses from the minister were supportive, they were often non-committal, and at one stage we heard quietly that quotas were "dead in the water". Not what we wanted to hear.

We were also deeply alarmed by the Interim Productivity Commission Report recommending suspension of copyright rules for Al training. The AWG led a rapid and united response from all guilds, including the ASSG, condemning the recommendation. We were frankly astonished that it had even been proposed.

On October 26, the Albanese government announced it would deny copyright exemptions for Al training. This is a significant first step in securing protections for writers, musicians, filmmakers and all Australian creatives. There is still much work to be done to legislate responsible use of Al in the creative industries, but this decision sets an encouraging precedent.

Another major announcement followed on November 4: the government legislated to extend local content quotas to streaming services. According to the MEAA, this legislation has been eight years in the making. The ASSG welcomes this decision and the speed with which it was enacted. While some say the guota percentage is too low or will have little impact, I can assure you the difference is substantial. Producers and streamers now have certainty around the rules, removing a major barrier to green-lighting projects. I expect production levels to rise in response and some streaming services will have some catching up to do.

You may notice the big red "N" around the awards today. Netflix sponsors the ASSG and many other guilds, and we welcome their partnership. Government, streamers and the ASSG share a common goal: to tell our stories in the best possible way and reach the largest audience. None of us wants to see the industry shrink, we all collectively want growth, opportunity and success, and working together is how we achieve that.

One way we support growth is by training new sound practitioners. Sue Kerr - Lifetime Achievement Award recipient and boom-swinging legend — identified a skills gap in young sound practitioners so she developed a course to address it, which the ASSG adopted and Screen Careers funded and delivered The first students have completed the Sound Assistant's Course in Perth, with one securing a job almost immediately. Screen Careers plan to roll out the course in Queensland, NSW, Victoria and South Australia. Congratulations to Sue Kerr and James Nowiczewski for leading this important work. More courses are in development too, so watch this space.

The ASSG hosted and co-hosted events in many states this year, often in conjunction with our sponsors such as AVID, Sennheiser, Sounds In Sync, Soundfirm and Netflix, run by our awesome state reps, Tfer Newsome in Queensland, Andy Wright in NSW, Paul Shanahan in Victoria, Carlos Manrique Clavijo in South Australia and Trevor Hope in Western Australia. I'm hoping to find more members and reps in ACT, Tasmania and Northern Territory so we can complete the country!

This year our committee has been super busy on many fronts and I want to take a moment to acknowledge the people who make our guild run. Without these amazing individuals there would be no ASSG; Adrienne Parr, Chloe Turner, Emma Bortignon, Sue Kerr, James Nowiczewski, Micky Lucy and ASSG Vice President, Xoe Baird.

It is with sadness that we announce Xoe will step down at year's end. Her contribution over the past five years has been extraordinary, and we are deeply grateful.

Enjoy your awards, celebrate together, and let's make 2026 even bigger — or should I say louder?





Paul 'Salty' Brincat was a much loved and respected sound recordist and ASSG member who passed away on June 1 this year, at home with his family after battling a brain tumour. Paul's contribution to film and television cannot be underestimated. He was and remains one of the leading and most innovative sound recordists of our time and he will be sorely missed.

Stephen Smith began his career in 1975 at Channel 7 in Sydney, right at the start of colour television. In 1987 Stephen and his wife Diana founded Tracks and have been post producing countless hours of iconic Australian television and film ever since.
