This award is named after Greg Bell who was a pioneering sound editor and sound designer. Greg started working in the Australian film industry in the 1970's, at the start of the new wave of Australian film. Greg Bell created the sound for many classic Australian films such as Picnic at Hanging Rock, The Last Wave, Gallipoli and The Cars That Ate Paris.

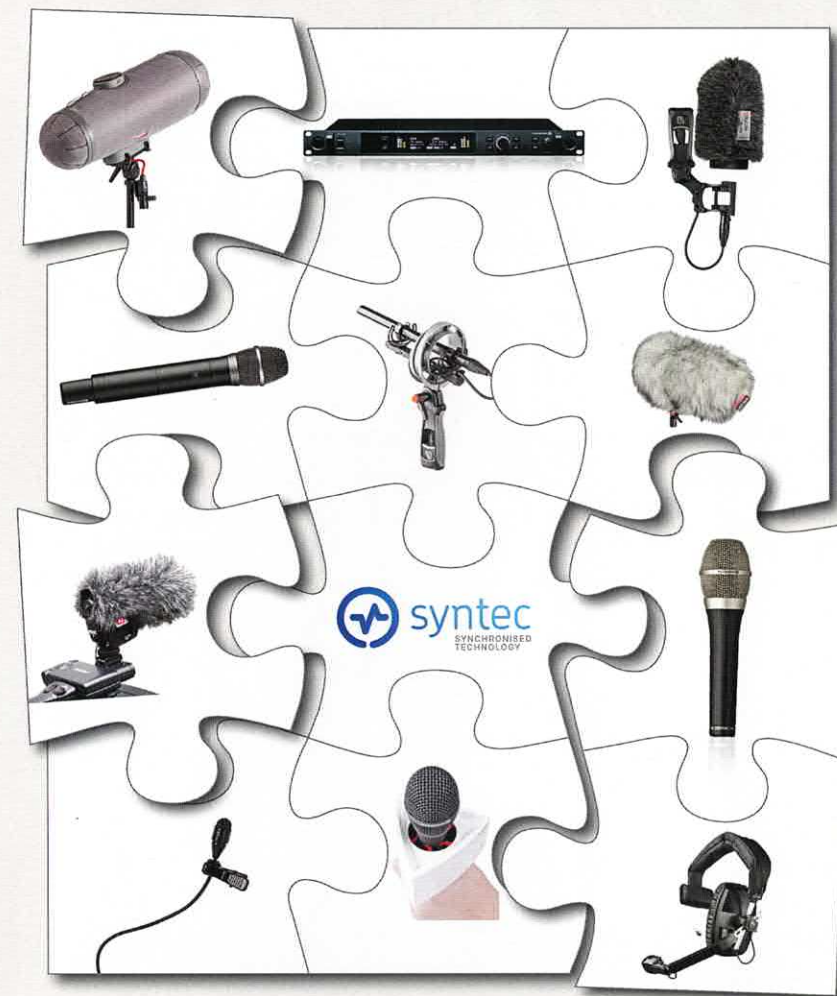

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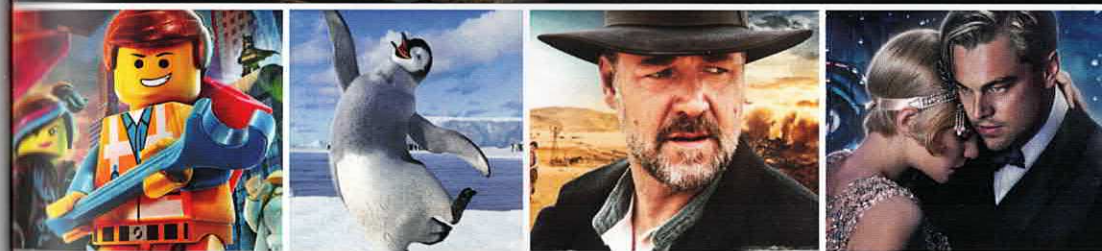
